Lauren Paige Small was born on August 1, 1994 in Bakersfield California. She lived with her parents Kevin and Tuesdy and her brother Kyle. She had numerous beloved pets and wanted to become a veterinarian. While attending Olive Drive Elementary School, Lauren was an outstanding student who participated in a variety of activities.

In April, 2003 Lauren broke her leg and six weeks later was diagnosed with Osteo Sarcoma bone cancer. She underwent five months of extensive chemotherapy. In November she had surgery which removed two-thirds of her tibia and replaced it with a prosthetic that could grow with her. After recovering from surgery, Lauren underwent five additional months of chemotherapy.

Lauren was a remarkable little girl who never complained about losing her long blonde hair, being dreadfully sick from the chemotherapy or enduring very painful surgery. She began physical therapy to gain strength in her leg and learn to walk again.

She accomplished things that her doctors said she would never be able to do including winning Rookie of the Year Championship in her age division and sixth overall in the 2003 horse show season.

In January of 2005, Lauren was again diagnosed with cancer. This time it was in her lungs, and modern medicine did not have much to offer. Her family began searching for an alternative treatment that might help. Lauren died December 1, 2005.

Laruen lived each day of her life to the fullest. She was kind and loving to everyone. Her smile and vibrant personality were contagious. The inspiration of her life lives on each and every day in the hearts of those who love her and in
